



## NESACS Members Receive ACS Awards

Three members of NESACS received awards at the general meeting of the Society on Tuesday, March 18, 2014, during the 247th ACS National Meeting in Dallas.

**Arthur C. Cope Award**, sponsored by the Arthur C. Cope Fund, **Stuart L. Schreiber**, Howard Hughes Medical Institute, Harvard University, and the Broad Institute of Harvard and MIT: *“For small molecule-based discoveries concerning signal transduction by calcineurin and mTOR and gene regulation by histone deacetylases, and for advancing the field of chemical biology.”*

**ACS Award for Creative Work in Synthetic Organic Chemistry**, sponsored by Aldrich Chemical Company, LLC, **Amir H. Hoveyda**, Boston College: *“For design and development of catalysts that promote organic reactions efficiently and stereoselectively and their application to efficient total syntheses of complex natural products.”*

**Priestley Medal**, sponsored by the American Chemical Society, **Stephen J. Lippard**, Massachusetts Institute of Technology: *“For mentoring legions of scientists in the course of furthering the basic science of inorganic chemistry and paving the way for improvements in human health.”*

In addition, the **James Flack Norris Award in Physical Organic Chemistry**, sponsored by the ACS Northeastern Section, was presented to **Matthew S. Platz**, The University of Hawaii, Hilo, and The Ohio State University (Emeritus): *“For his contributions to pioneering ultrafast time-resolved studies of the photochemical formation of carbenes and nitrenes.”*
